

COVID-19 Contingency Planning



What to include

Skills for Care consulted with adult social care providers in England about what to include in their Contingency Plans. Whilst plans varied, there were some consistencies which we have drawn out in this document. We have deliberately not created a template as we recognise the breadth of provision across the sector, but you can reflect on key points and incorporate into your own COVID-19 Contingency Plan.

Many of the examples we reviewed included similar focus and we think using the acronym POWERS (people, other, workforce, environment, regulations, supplies) can help you to shape and review your COVID-19 Contingency Plan. There is information below about key things to think about and what other resources can help.
