During the webinar, the phrase 'moral injury' was used. Can you provide more information about this as this is a new term for me.

 Arabella Kurtz, Clinical Lead, Stronger Together Wellbeing Hub Northamptonshire -Moral injury relates to when you have to do things in your job, which violate your moral code (your values). The term first originated in the military, and it has been used for workers in social care and health during the pandemic.

'Moral injury can occur when someone engages in, fails to prevent, or witnesses acts that conflict with their values or beliefs and when they experience betrayal by trusted others especially when this is perceived as avoidable, or they are powerless to change it.' <u>Technical Advisory Group: moral injury in health care workers during the COVID-19</u> pandemic
